

Border One

Please read through the directions before you begin. You should have knowledge of sewing as well as how to use templates to complete this project.

- Use high quality patchwork/quilting fabrics and thread for longer endurance.
- All dimensions are given in inches.
- Use a **scant** 1/4" seam allowance for all seams unless otherwise given.
- Finger press as you go. Use a warm iron to set your seams. Do not use steam to press your seams; the bias edges will become distorted. Starch if desired.
- Use a 2.0 to 2.5 stitch length for sewing.

Difficulty: Easy

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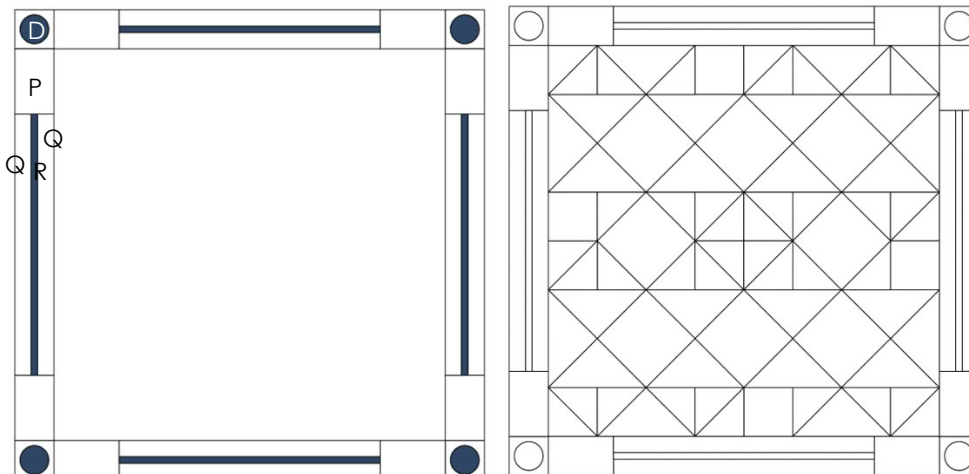

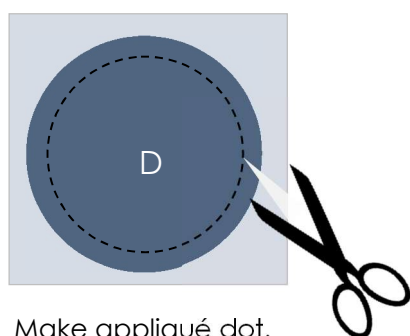

Border Overview and Color Scheme

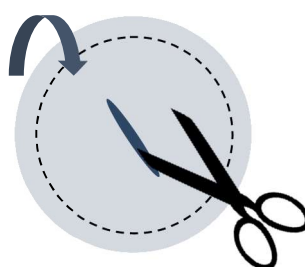


Making the Dot Blocks 3" x 3" Finished

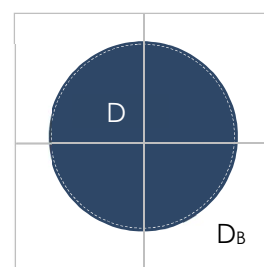
1. Sew one Patch D to one 3" x 3" dryer sheet or water soluble appliqué sheet using a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance RST. Trim seam allowance on the appliqué sheet to the seam allowance sewn.
2. Cut a small slit about 1" in the appliqué sheet. Cut slips along the outside of the dot in the seam allowance to help ease the curves. Flip right side out. Use a pointed utensil such as scissors or a chop stick to push the seam allowance flat. Press.
3. Fold the appliqué dot in half horizontally and vertically as well as the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " D_B background patch. Center and appliqué using your favorite stitch. Make (4) blocks.

Center and appliqué.

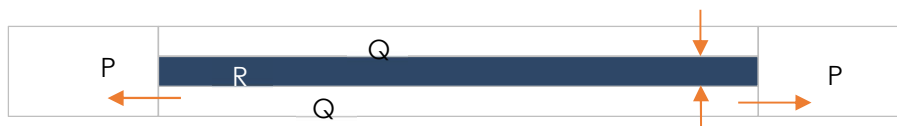
Alternate Method: You can also use the Raw Edge Appliqué Method. Fuse the Accent fabric onto a paper backed fusible web product such as Pellon Wunder Under or Vliesoline Soluvlies. Trace Template D without the seam allowance directly on the back of the paper. Cut out circle along the line. Remove paper. Iron and fuse to the center of Patch D_B. Stitch with a straight stitch or zigzag stitch.

Absolutely No Appliqué Method

If you do not like to appliqué, you can omit the circle and use $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " squares in the accent color instead. The effect is slightly different.

Making the Striped Border 3" x 30" Finished

Sew one Q Patch to each side of one R Patch. Press towards the darker color. Trim to $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $20\frac{1}{2}$ " if necessary. Sew one P Patch to each end of striped border block. Press outwards towards P. Your strip should measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $30\frac{1}{2}$ ". Make (4) blocks.

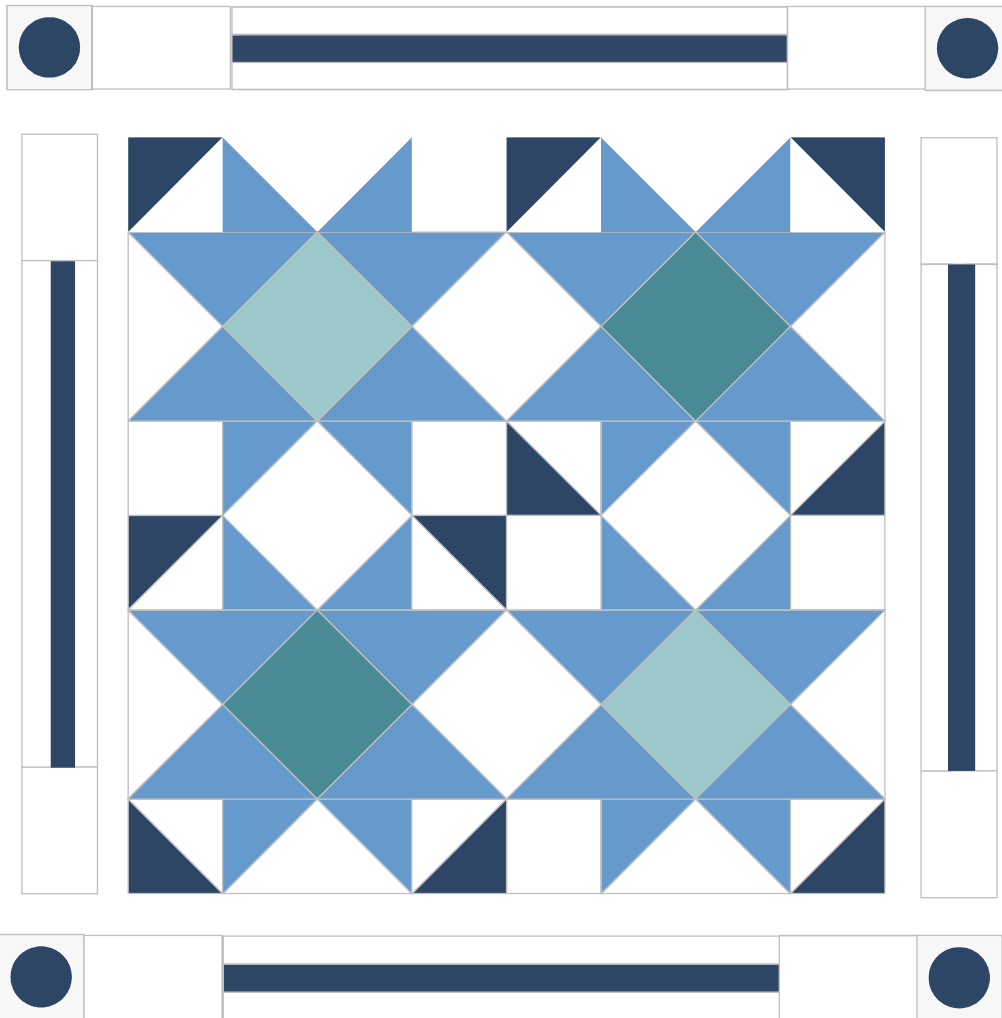


Alternate Method: You can also sew two strips of Q/R/Q the entire WOF. Subcut (2) - $20\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Sew Patch P to complete the border.

Sew one D corner patch on to each end of one Striped Border. Press inwards towards the stripe. Make (2) (top & bottom) borders.



Sew the shorter sides onto the right and left sides of the center medallion. Sew the top and bottom borders on next.
